## STABLEFORD COMPETITION

A Stableford competition is a golf tournament in which the object is to get the highest score. That's because in Stableford, golfers are awarded points based on their scores in relation to a fixed score (par in this case) at each hole.

For this tournament points will be awarded for your NET HOLE SCORE as follows:

Double Bogie (or higher)	0
Bogie	1
Par	2
Birdie	3
Eagle	4


Once you get to **net** double bogie, you can pick up you ball. **Picking up in this game and taking "0" points does not disqualify the player for the day**. For your gross score take your score most likely not to exceed your maximum score for handicap posting purposes.

## **COMPLETION OF THE SCORECARD:**

For each hole you will record 3 numbers:

- Above the diagonal line, record the gross score
  - Subtract the number of POPs for the hole from the gross score and record it below the diagonal line. This is the NET SCORE.
  - Using the NET SCORE, determine whether it is a par, bogie, birdie, etc. Using the chart above record the number of points the person receives on the line labeled "Net Points".

Example: On a par 5 hole, the player takes 8 strokes. She has 2 POPs giving her a NET SCORE of 6. Referring to the points chart above, 6 is a bogie and is worth 1 Stableford point.
